

Jeep Webb graduated from Tulia High School in 1949 where he participated in football, basketball, track, boxing, and baseball. He graduated from West Texas State Teacher's College in 1955. Coach Webb went on to receive his Master's Degree in 1963 from West Texas State College.

His first coaching job was in Littlefield, Texas in 1955 where he was head basketball coach and an assistant football coach. In 1958, he moved to Borger, Texas as an assistant football coach. From 1960 to 1965 Coach Webb coached in Canyon, where he started the first girls' track and basketball program and Pampa.



In 1966 he returned to Borger as assistant football coach and head track coach. During the next thirty-one years he coached football, cross-country, track, and girls' basketball, as well as serving as assistant principal for several years. Coach Webb was successful in many athletic programs including football, girls' basketball, boys' and girls' track, boys' and girls' cross country, and teaching history. Retiring in 1997 from coaching and teaching, he currently drives Bulldogs of all ages in the transportation department.

Coach Webb started the Fellowship of Christian Athletes Chapters in several of the Texas Panhandle schools including Borger. He served on the Board of Directors for the Texas High School Coaches Association for 3 years. Coach Webb was inducted into The Texas Girls Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2011. He received the "Man of the Year" Award from the Borger community. He received the Community Builder Award from the Masonic Grand Lodge of Texas, and the Mirabeau Lamar Award for Public Education from the Masons.

Coach Webb has always been actively involved in the lives of students at BISD. The number of lives Coach Webb has impacted in more than four decades from football to cross country would be impossible to count. He is always there for students, teachers, and coaches, past and present, to give a helpful word of encouragement and a smile or a hug to say, "*You can do your best!*" He has helped many young people reach their goals because of his positive influences and lifelong lessons.

Coach Webb married Norma Thompson of Tulia in 1950 and has two children, Tana Stephens of Lubbock and Typ Webb of Amarillo. He has three grandchildren and five great grandchildren.
